Highway elevation at summit 1775m



Highest all season pass in British Columbia



47 avalanche paths over 35 km



One of the most active avalanche control programs in the province due to the location of the highway and the nature of the terrain above the highway.



24/7 avalanche control capability

Kootenay Pass Data

Average of 400 avalanche events per season


1 in 3 events affect the Highway

Average snowfall = 10m

Staff 2 full time avalanche technicians, 4 seasonal avalanche assistants.

Closure time = 80 hours per season. Mostly done in 2-3h closure blocks.


Northfork Avalanche area. East side of the summit



- 3 separate avalanche areas
- Avalanche control in 1/2h
- Average avalanche deposit cleanup time 1-2h.
